The *Examen* is a method of reviewing your day in the presence of God. It's actually an attitude more than a method, a time set aside for thankful reflection on where God is in your everyday life. It has five steps, which most people take more or less in order, and it usually takes 15 to 20 minutes per day. Here it is in a nutshell:

Until you make peace
with who you are,
you will never be content
with what you have.

- 1** Ask God for light.
I want to look at my day with God's eyes, not merely my own.
- 2** Give thanks.
The day I have just lived is a gift from God. Be grateful for it.
- 3** Review the day.
I carefully look back on the day just completed, being guided by the Holy Spirit.
- 4** Face your shortcomings.
I face up to what is wrong—in my life and in me.
- 5** Look toward the day to come.
I ask where I need God in the day to come.

THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK

The shamrock is more than a national anthem - it is God's family crest. The tiny leaf speaks of the eternal life of God - Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, bonded in a love which is vibrant, majestic, magnetic, and pulsing with life.

The second crest is the Sign of the Cross. It too speaks of love. When we are making the sign of the Cross we are pledging ourselves to God and we are praying that God will delve into our lives. It is the first prayer parents teach their child - it may be the last sign we make before our death.

The Holy Trinity is a mystery - it is impossible to explain God, but we could make the prayer of the old fisherman our prayer each day – "PROTECT ME O LORD, MY BOAT IS SMALL - AND YOUR SEA IS SO BIG".

An intolerable problem

One in four women and about one in six men suffer from domestic abuse in their lifetime. Two women are killed every week in England by a partner or ex-partner.

The Catholic bishops of England and Wales, Scotland, and Ireland have chosen to focus on domestic abuse as the theme for Day for Life 2019. We wish to raise awareness of the prevalence of this issue across our countries. We acknowledge that men, women and children suffer domestic abuse at the hands of husbands, wives, parents and other family members. Violence of this kind should never

be tolerated or justified. It is an offence against the dignity of the human person.

The Church recognises the hurt done to those who have experienced domestic abuse. Pope Francis writes:

"Unacceptable customs still need to be eliminated. I think particularly of the shameful ill-treatment to which women are sometimes subjected, domestic violence and various forms of enslavement which, rather than a show of masculine power, are craven acts of cowardice. The verbal, physical, and sexual violence that women endure in some marriages contradicts the very nature of the conjugal union." (*Amoris Laetitia* 54)

How can Catholic parishes and communities be places of safety, welcome, and assistance?

This is a call to action for our parishes, schools and Catholic communities to reflect, learn, and act together so that we can help those suffering from domestic abuse in our parishes, our workplaces, and even in our own homes. Knowing what to look for and spotting the signs means that individually and collectively we can make a real difference to people's lives.

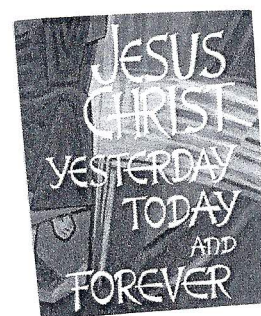
