A WORD ON THE DEVOTION TO THE SACRED HEART OF JESUS

Hanging in a privileged position in many of our homes is a framed picture of the Sacred Heart. If it is an old picture it will bear the inscription "I will bless every place in which an image of my heart is exposed and honoured". While it is the Head of the Household, what it stands for is the Heart.

Devotion to the Sacred Heart is very much in keeping with our faith, because the heart is about love and our faith is about love. Even in everyday conversation the word 'heart' comes up several times. We say: "He has his heart in the right place", "She is a kind hearted person", "Don't lose heart", "That person has a heart of gold", "I love you with all my heart". Apart from conversation you see the heart drawn in children's work, or into trunks of trees. It's the symbol of love.

So the heart can be described as the origin of our relationships, as the place where God addresses his love. It stands for the person and for what the person is and so it is most fitting that we use it of Jesus Christ.

Devotion to the Sacred Heart goes back to June 16, 1675 when Our Lord appeared to Sr Margaret Mary Alacoque. "Most Sacred Heart of Jesus I place all my trust in you."
