Life of a Parish Secretary in a living virtual parish.

What has changed in my role as Parish Secretary -

The busy days with lots of volunteers in and out of the presbytery –

The knocks at the door - not knowing who will be there and what question will be asked or what request for help will be made. The phone calls giving me the honour of speaking to someone dealing with all aspects of life's journey from the joy of a Baptism or a Wedding to the sad passing of family and friends –

no longer being taken by me to pass on to Fr Des. The cancelled bookings in the parish centre and crossed out meetings in the diary —

The many times each week I get to open the door and walk into our beautiful Church, even if it is just to check how many candles we need to order.

This is a privilege I will no longer take for granted. The first few weeks of still being able to work in the office - that I feel very much at home in - were strange enough. No one was allowed to visit but the lockdown brought its own challenge of what I would need to have to be able to work entirely from home. Some things never changed - the Parish bills still need to be paid.

The circle of life keeps moving on as families lose love ones and so dealing with cemetery records still needs to be done. Although not meeting the cemetery contractor, grave digger, stone mason or funeral directors face to face - many of whom I have known for a number of years and even able call some of them friends.

The continued support of the Archdiocese finance, gift aid and communications teams is fantastic, although they are learning to adapt to this new way of working too.

The use of email and the online websites enable me to carry on with many aspects of my job. However the impersonal nature of it highlights more and more what is missing. The little thing of being able to ask a question and getting an instant response or thought.

The generosity of parishioners never ceases to amaze me. Daily requests asking how donations can still be made although physical collections are no longer possible. The overwhelming offers of help for others in our parish, all under social distancing measures. A small word of thanks - written at end of a text or an email - for what I do meaning more than anyone will ever appreciate.

Wanting to give everyone I have got to know over the last 8 years a call just to say "hi and are you ok" but knowing it's an impossible task.

However I feel and I hope that I am still there to support our parish priest and parishioners although not in the ways we are all used to.

We are after all - all in this together.
