COVID 19 GUIDANCE FROM THE ARCHDIOCESE OF BIRMINGHAM

- Anyone displaying any symptoms of covid-19 should stay at home and not travel to church or participate in person
- A mask must be worn at all times in Church unless you have a medical exception.
- Hand sanitiser is available to those attending the Church.
- That there is good ventilation and air throughout in the building; in this case. please wear warm clothes.

All parishes are invited to gather, listen actively to one another and reflect on what is said. This is not a time for discussion but of openness to one another, and to the guidance of the Holy Spirit.

The 3 areas for reflection are;

1	Communion	 the life of the Church, it's place in our lives,
		- how we listen to one another.
		 are all people included in parish life?
		- our concerns for the Church.
2	Participation	 what the Mass means to us
		 the place of prayer in our lives.
		 do we involve everyone in parish life.
		 do we use everyone's gifts and talents.
3	Mission	- how can we as a parish help those around us.
		- do we feel able to share our faith with others.
		 are we able to help those in need.
		- what is God's plan for our parish?

<u>All</u> parishioners are encouraged to be a part of this process of consultation and reflection.

Mission	- 6th- 20th February.
