Moving forward – issues arising from the synodal pathway discussions

Pope Francis' call for a synodal Church, where there is a constant dialogue and reflection on how we move forward, in a call to us at Our Lady and All Saints to engage together in a positive manner to renew the life of our parish. This is not a one-off – but the start of a new process which will hopefully engage everyone in one way or another. The following best reflects many of the issues and areas of parish life which were documented during the synodal pathway meetings. Some can be addressed in the short –term – others may take more time. What is important is that we make a start now. Fr Philip

 - supporting those who need support
 - SVP

 - website
 - webcam
 - youth catechesis
5. Youth Work
 - youth club
 - servers
 - children's liturgy
 - sacramental preparation
6. Schools
 - liaison with St Joseph's and Hagley
 - links with parents, staff and students
 - making the schools part of our parish
 - involvement in parish life
7. Contacts with local community
 - Churches Together
 - local organisations and projects
 - raising OLAS profile in Stourbridge
8. Evangelisation and Mission
 - lay training e.g., children's liturgy
 - home visiting
 - faith friends
 - encouraging spiritual growth

The purpose of the meeting is to identify how we move forward on each of these areas, and to identify the members of the parish who are going to take responsibility for them.

Our Lady and All Saints Parish 400 CLUB

Our Parish 400 Club has provided the funds for the Parish Centre refurbishment programme which is now completed, thank you to all who are members for their support over the years enabling this work to be carried out.

This programme has included:

YOUTH SECTION: The old furniture removed and new easy clean chairs, replastering as required along with redecoration. The wooden flooring has been sanded and resealed along with new flooring replacing the old vinyl tiles.

TOILETS: New flooring throughout and along with redecoration and provision of automatic timed lighting. Replacement partitions in both Ladies and Gents toilets along with a hand dryer for the accessible unit.

CORRIDORS: Redecoration and new flooring throughout

KITCHEN: New cooker and Dishwasher installed.

In addition to this work the 400 Club has provided funds over many years for redecoration of our Church, new sound system, defibrillator, chairs, crockery and much more!
