LIVE SIMPLY THEME FOR FEBRUARY Try to eat a more plant-based diet. Lent begins this month, and that's a good time to reduce the amount of meat that we eat. Meat production is the single biggest cause of deforestation globally. With the dramatic growth in global population that has occurred in recent years, eating meat regularly is simply not a sustainable option. It has been calculated that in the UK, we need to be eating 70% less meat and dairy by 2030 to prevent climate breakdown.
