Our Lady and All Saints Church, Stourbridge Results of Parish Questionnaire January 2025

Introduction

In late 2024 it was decided to carry out a Parish Questionnaire to discover the views of the congregation. This was issued at the beginning of December 2024 asking for up to three items which were considered good or going well in the Parish and up to three which could be better, or people would like to see. These were available throughout December 2024 and the results were analysed in January 2025 ahead of the Parish Visitation planned for February 2025. This report attempts to summarise the returns received. A total of 43 returns were received and are analysed below.

Things that were Good or Going Well

In this section, a few respondents identified less than three items in this category and many combined together a number of factors which we have attempted to reflect below.

Pastoral

The work of the **SVP** and the care for the elderly and infirm were mentioned by 9 respondents. The provision of monthly lunches and the cinema club were also praised as being supportive of the elderly. The support for people in hospital was also applauded.

The work of the **Youth Club** and the appointment of a **Parish Youth Worker** were praised in 15 responses, and many emphasised the importance of this in building for the future. The excellent work of the **Parish Secretary** was also widely commended.

Several responders mentioned the **Synodal Pathway meetings** as both helpful, informative and well attended. Many hoped that the new **Parish Council** will be a useful mechanism to further develop the Parish. The opportunities to comment upon the proposed new **Parish Centre** were welcomed.

Spiritual

The **Clergy** were praised in 16 returns. Words used included hard-working, welcoming, strong, stimulating, sensitive, prayerful, approachable, sincere and authentic with excellent leadership. Many thought that the Parish was very fortunate to have two priests and a deacon and hoped this would continue. The quality of the **homilies** was mentioned in several responses as being enriching. The **Altar Servers** were also congratulated and the **Children's Liturgy** and the **5 pm Family Mass** were also praised.

The many and diverse **opportunities for worship** were welcomed by a number of respondents. The provision of Mass with Anointing, Holy Hour, Divine Mercy, praying before the Blessed Sacrament, Rosary and many opportunities for Mass including daily Masses and three Sunday Masses, the variety of Eucharistic Prayers and the opportunities for Confession, Prayer and Meditation were mentioned and appreciated. This particularly helps people with busy lives. The spiritual atmosphere and moments of silence were welcomed. The use of two readers at some Masses was liked. One response praised the opportunity to kneel at Communion and the **Ignatian Prayer Group** was praised. One respondent welcomed the conservative delivery of Mass which should not be lost.

The **Children's Sacramental programme** was highlighted, and the candlelit Carol service and parish/school activities were also praised. Many responses mentioned the **Music** provision in Masses. The **Choir** and the **Music Group** both came in for praise.

Practical

A number of responses mentioned the **Beautiful Church** and the wonderful **Flower Arranging**. The availability and extent of the free parking were much appreciated. The **Friday opening** was praised as was the fact that the church seemed warmer in recent times. The work of the **Welcomers** was mentioned by several people and the **Parish** was described as being inviting, well run, thriving, in good heart, friendly and generous. People appreciate the refreshments after the 11 am Sunday Mass.

People appreciated the regular Parish events for the community and participation in Churches Together in Stourbridge. The **Toddler Group** was also mentioned. The Parish community is considered to be supportive and outreaching.

Things that could be better or we would like to see in the parish.

(43 replies with very little repetition)

Pastoral

- Church needs to be more vital and attractive for families and young people, congregation focussed, warm, safe, inviting, welcoming, and where people feel valued. (Several replies said this) More Welcomers on the rota might help.
- Improved socialising (e.g. coffee) after all Masses. A side door would be more congenial than the one situated on the ring road. Speak to people you don't know.
- More social activities with wider participation, especially for the elderly.
- Bereavement support group.
- Better school/parish links with more involvement of parents and families in the parish.
- Subsidised pilgrimages (especially for young people) and Church trips.
- Religious library.

Spiritual

- Many comments were about Mass times which do not suit everyone. Some wanted more evening Masses, or later than 9am on weekdays, with Sunday 11am being too late for some.
- More healing Masses, Eucharistic Services when the priest is not available, more volunteers for reader/minister, and someone would like to see Deacon Tom at Sunday 8.30am occasionally!
- Priests should face the congregation for all of the Mass, announce which Eucharistic Prayer is being used and give the page numbers for the preface and readings. Could we sit down for the notices?
- Homilies 7mins maximum and aimed at children if Mass is school-led, which should be 1/month or at least 1/term.
- Communion under both kinds was requested twice, and 3 complaints about the benches in front of the altar were made. It was also said that reminding people that some could not receive communion was not very inviting.
- A prayer request box (for the living) could be taken up at the Offertory.
- Services of Reconciliation have been very popular in the past. Evening Bible Study groups were suggested.
- A Mission for Parish Renewal, forming an actively listening and responding community, was advocated. The previous 'Night Fever' missions were commended.

Music

- Music featured on many replies, with diverse opinions. Latin is generally not appreciated, some wanted singing at 8.30am, no music on Sat. 5pm, relevant modern hymns, more hymns to Our Lady, sung chants, psalms and antiphons.
- Use of 'Laudate' or newer hymn books was requested.
- School choir and band could lead the music if the liturgy is for, or involving, children.

Practical

- Newsletters to be sent by email.
- More varied and electronic communication, with use of modern technology. (2 replies)
- Elected Parish Council with equal M/F representation. (2 replies)
- Opportunities to use Synodal methods of discernment.
- More publicity for different groups in the parish and how to make contact with those who lead them.
- Important to keep things going when Hall is being rebuilt.
